Remembrance 2022

On Sunday, 13 November the Parish came together in Shevington Memorial Garden to remember those who gave their lives in war so that we might have a better tomorrow.

The parade and the short service at the Memorial, led by the Vicar of St Anne's, Rev Andrew Brown, were very well attended. Wreaths were laid on behalf of the residents of the Parish by the Chairman and members of the Parish Council at the War Memorials in Shevington and Appley Bridge and also at the Miners' Memorial outside St Anne's Church. Wreaths were also laid on behalf of many local organisations.

Local schools held short ceremonies in various locations at different times on Friday, 11 November, when representatives of pupils laid wreaths at the WWI Memorial trees in Stockley Park (Shevington Vale) and Shevington Memorial Park and also at the War Memorial.

Our thanks go to the very many people involved in the organisation of the Service on Remembrance Sunday and the preparation that went beforehand. Everything went very well. However, we would like to apologise for the problems with our PA system - we are looking into making improvements next year.

Special thanks must go to the Tomlinson Group Ltd for carrying out restoration work on both the War and the Diamond Jubilee Memorials.

Herbert Cheshire

One of the names on our War Memorial is that of Herbert Cheshire, who died on 5 May, 1916. He was a Quartermaster Sergeant in the Royal Field Artillery. Herbert left a widow, Jessie, and four children, Elsie, Phyllis, Muriel and John. Those four children may well have been the grandparents of people alive today. Are you one of them?
