Warning! - There is Danger on the Ice

Please remind children how dangerous frozen canals, ponds and other waterways can be at this time of year. Although they look pretty and tempting, they are dangerous and can be fatal, particularly during a cold spell like the one we experienced just before Christmas.

Just a few points to remember :

• Don't wander too near the edge - icy or wet conditions could cause you to slip and fall in.

• Don't be tempted to test the thickness of the ice - it's easy to slip from the bank and fall through into the freezing water.

Make sure your children understand how dangerous it is to play on ice.
Adults should set a good example by staying off the ice themselves.

• Dog owners should ensure they keep their pets on a short lead so they are not at risk of falling in.
