Crooke Village Flooding - July 2023

Heavy rainfall throughout July brought a shock to residents of Crooke Village on Sunday, 23 July. After 2 days of continuous rain on Saturday 22nd and Sunday 23rd July the Mill Brook, that runs from high ground to Standish Lower Ground and through Crooke Village into the River Douglas, overflowed into Crooke

Park and subsequently onto Crooke Road by Crooke Marina. The water is backed up in the brook then overflows due to the sheer volume and incapacity of the pipes to move it quickly into the canal and river. Over the last 8 years this has happened 6 times. This was the first time it had happened in the summer months. Options for flood defences and/or

a redirection of the water to keep it away from the under

road sewers, and sending it into the Marina and river, are being investigated and costed for the future.
