Shevington Parish Council Chairman's Report to the Annual Parish Meeting 19 May 2021

The Clerk 's report covers all the details of Parish Council activities throughout this year. You will find there details of the developments of important village projects such as :

- Vicarage Lane sports club development and the progress they have made,
- The allotment developments both at Vicarage Lane and at the Forest Fold site,
- The Memorial Park Drainage project.

Imagine our disappointment that our Heritage Lottery bid was cancelled even though it had been accepted for further scrutiny! All bids received in March of 2020 were cancelled because of Covid. The HLF money was to be directed to agricultural and economic projects. The report explains our decision therefore to consult with residents about taking out a loan. This is a long delayed project.

We need to save our waterlogged park, it's decaying children's play area and it's broken pathways. Its lovely trees are dying due to constant waterlogging.

The response from residents was positive. We have now applied for the loan. If we are successful, we hope work will go ahead later this summer.

The report also describes how we, as councillors, involve ourselves in the community and the work the Parish Council does to maintain the property which belongs to all of us as residents.

Now I need to say 'Thank You' to a number of people.

On behalf of the Parish Council, I would like to say a big 'Thank You' to all those of you who have given time and energy to help neighbours and friends during this time of pandemic. Many of you have helped with shopping or with simple practical acts of kindness. Others - working as groups – have made sure vital supplies were available for the more vulnerable. Others have helped combat loneliness.

Our Parish can be proud of the generous community spirit shown at this difficult time.

Thank you also to those who helped brighten our lives and stave off the gloom the 'In Bloom' groups for the continued bright flower displays.... the Christmas window displays in village shops..... these have all helped keep up our spirits.... thank you all!
