1021 Christmas Tree Railings

- for consideration and agreement in principle

The Chairman has recently been approached by several residents who have drawn her attention to the news that decorative railings are being installed around Standish's living Christmas tree after a successful fundraising campaign. The living tree was planted and decorated for Christmas 2017 by Standish Christmas Decorations Group, which was set up by Standish Voice and includes representatives from various organisations across the village.

The money raised is being used to install decorative railings 1.2m high (necessary to meet H&S requirements) around the tree. The general view is that they will be much better than the unsightly metal fencing which has been used in previous years. The railings and their gate will be permanent and will match the ones which currently surround the nearby historic well.

According to Standish Voice's Facebook page, the total money raised came to £3,030.

The living tree – which will eventually grow to 8m in height - was donated by Holts Brewery (who operate The Lychgtae pub) and the decorations cost £440. The balance is being spent on the railings and flagging, with a sum being set aside for future care of the tree. The residents have asked whether the Parish Council would consider installing similar railings around the tree in the centre of Shevington. There are several things to be given consideration:

- (a) Whether 1.2m would be considered by the LA to be sufficiently tall in relation to the tree (on H&S grounds) at this location.
- (b) Whether a permanent fence would be acceptable to the LA at this location on H&S grounds the tree is at junction that is already blind and permanent fencing would add to this all year round.
- (c) Cost.

Eccleston PC provide a Christmas tree along the main road through the village – it is on a bend and is not a living tree. 1.2m decorative fencing is installed each year around the tree. The fencing comes in panels which are installed into sconces permanently installed in the ground surrounding the tree pit.

The tree at the centre of Shevington is already installed into a tree pit. One possibility would be to follow Eccleston's example, provided this would be acceptable to the LA. The railings could then be removed at the end of the festive season and put into storage until the following year.

All of the above need further investigation.

If this were to happen with regard to the tree in Shevington, the same would have to be provided for the other three trees.

Members are invited to give these matters their consideration and agree the best way forward in principle.

1022 Standish Neighbourhood Plan – *for agreement* (enclosed)

Wigan Council is currently consulting on the final draft of the **Standish Neighbourhood Plan**, produced by Standish Voice, under Regulation 16 of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012.

The Draft Plan and all associated documents (many of which are very large) are available to view on the LA's website at www.wigan.gov.uk/standishplan. The draft Plan is 86 pages long and the 'Basic Conditions' document is 31 pages long. These two have been downloaded and will be circulated by email. Members without online access at home can access all documents online at Shevington Library.

As a statutory consultee, the Parish Council have received an invitation to comment on the final draft. There is an online response form and members may comment on any or all of the following:

- (a) General comment
- (b) Village centre enhancement
- (c) Reducing traffic congestion
- (d) Open space
- (e) Housing
- (f) Maximising funding
- (g) Sport, leisure and community facilities
- (h) Renewable energy

The deadline for submitting comments is 11:45pm on Wednesday 19 December.

1023 Allotment Plot Boundary Works – for approval

The tenant of one of the plots on the main allotment site at Forest Fold has asked for permission to cut down a dead tree on the boundary between his plot and the bowling green. The allotments liaison officer has had a look and has confirmed that it is indeed completely dead, with branches falling on the ground. As there are no TPOs on trees on the site and the tree is dead anyway, there is no need to seek permission from the LA for the removal of the tree.

The plot holder has also said that he would be willing to sort out the rest of this boundary on the allotments side of the site at no cost to the Parish Council. This would first entail:

- (a) removing an alder,
- (b) cutting back branches on a large ash tree which is growing towards the bowling green,
- (c) pruning hawthorn and holly bushes,
- (d) and taking out some wild saplings.

He would then plant whips of suitable species, including crab apple, cornus, hawthorn, and wild rose to thicken the hedge.

The tenant is a forester by trade, so he knows what he is doing. This particular boundary is in serious need of renovation and looks an eyesore from the bowling green. The Clerk has explained that, if members agree to this, then a risk assessment would be carried out and he would be able to carry out the work as a volunteer – he would then be covered by the Parish Council's insurance.

Members are invited to consider the request, accept the offer and approve the work.
