Nestling in Forest Fold (off Miles Lane, Appley Bridge – near Broadriding Road) Shevington Parish Council have a bowling green. For a small membership subscription of £20 per person for the season you may play there in daylight hours over the weekend and during the week, when it is not being used for team fixtures or other events. Anyone under the age of twenty may play for FREE. Membership forms are

available from Shevington Library, from our websites or by contacting the Clerk.

Every Thursday evening members of Shevington Garden Club hold a practice session

at the green. Beginners wishing to learn how to bowl or experienced bowlers wishing to bowl with others in a friendly session are welcome to join them. The other three teams that form Shevington Village Bowling Club play at home on alternate Monday and Wednesday evenings and on Wednesday afternoons. The SVBC teams are always on the lookout for new team members - both experienced and beginners. Interested? – Please contact the Clerk for more information.

Teams are welcome to book the green for their fixtures. The fee for the 2024 season remains unchanged at £100. If, as a group, you would like to have

sole use of the bowling green for a single session event lasting up to a day, we ask you to make a contribution of £30, payable in advance. Interested? - Please contact the Clerk.

How Do You Add 'Tram & Train' to Your Bus Pass?

If you have a TfGM-issued older person's travel pass, to benefit from unlimited off-peak travel on trams and trains in Greater Manchester you need to pay an annual £10 fee. This does not affect your entitlement to free, off-peak bus travel across England and, if you only use buses, you can choose not to pay to add tram and train. The £10 charge does not apply to concessionary passes for disabled people.

You'll be covered for a full year from the date you pay. After this you should renew when you next need to travel by tram or train. You can pay online, by taking your travel pass into a TfGM Travelshop or in your local PayPoint store – look for the 'P' logo.

To buy online, you will need to link your concessionary pass to a Bee Card account. Once you have paid online, please allow 24 hours for the transaction to complete. After this you will need to touch-in with your concessionary pass at a

Metrolink smart reader within 14 days at any tram stop, and your pass will be updated to show you have paid to add tram and train.

Christmas Shop-Front Award

Pam Powell – our judge for a number of years – was unable to judge the Christmas Shop-Front windows this year. However, Cllr Helen Thompson - a relative newcomer to the Parish Council scene – stepped into the breach and very ably took Pam's place.

The Parish Council agreed with Cllr Thompson's recommendations. First prize went to Appley Blossom of Miles Lane, Appley Bridge - a relative newcomer to the area - who nominated Woodlands Animal Sanctuary at Ormskirk as the recipient of the £60 donation.

Jordan's Fish & Chips (of Gathurst Lane, Shevington) - another old favourite - won third prize and nominated Wigan & Leigh Hospice for the £30 donation.

Cllr Jess Diggle, Vice Chairman of the Parish Council, visited the winning shops to make the presentations on Friday, 19 January - at the end of a week which had begun with gridlock on roads in the Parish due to heavy snow.
